But there has bee a surprising amount, much of it bipartisan

Areas where NQF has provided technical assistance

- Health information Technology
- Telehealth
- Medicaid
- Chronic care
- End of life care
- Rural health

Technology Related Bills

Bi-partisan desire to "fix" interoperability through legislation

- House Cures bill passed in 2015; Senate companion bill still a work in progress
- Senate HELP held 6 hearings
- TRUST-IT (S. 2141) NQF role included

Bi-partisan desire to advance Telehealth in Medicare

- Connect for Health Act (S.2484; H.R. 4442)
- Quality measures included assess access, clinical outcomes, diagnostic accuracy, patient quality of life, etc

Expect to See a Focus on Medicaid in 2017

Senate Finance – Medicaid Reporting

Exploring current state or future policy effort

Republican House Medicaid Task Force

 No policy has emerged but there is a great deal of prep for 2017

Focus on Populations or Services

- Moms & Babies Bill (S.466; H.R. 4695)
- Medically complex children ACE Kids Act (H.R. 546)
- Rep Pallone's interest in improving LTSS within Medicaid

Medicare: Proposals to improve care for specific populations

Senate Finance released bi-partisan policy proposals focused on improving chronic care in Dec 2015

- NQF submitted a comment letter in response and participated in two follow up meetings
- Bill language has not emerged

Senator Whitehouse proposed bill to improve palliative and end of life care via CMMI

NQF Rural Health Report has Generated Considerable Interest



Senators Focused on Legislation & HHS

NQF Rural Report briefing raised visibility and interest

- April 2016 briefing included Senators Franken (D-MN) & Barrasso (R-WY) plus 3 committee members
- Senator Franken expected to introduce a bill this week to improve rural health quality that includes a Rural MAP and support for endorsed measures
- Bi-partisan letter --Franken (D-MN) and Roberts (R-KN)
 -- plus others requests that HHS initiate a Rural MAP
