- The Joint Commission new proposed standards
- 2016 Leapfrog Hospital Survey: Public reporting of hospital compliance with CDC Core Elements
- New implementation guidelines from the Infectious Diseases Society of America and the Society for Healthcare Epidemiology of America
- Anthem incorporated an Antibiotic Stewardship measure into its Quality-In-Sights Hospital Incentive Program (Q-HIP[®])
- The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released a proposed rule encouraging hospitals to compare their antibiotic prescribing to national benchmarks, and evaluate and improve as needed
