NQF Endorsement: The Gold Standard



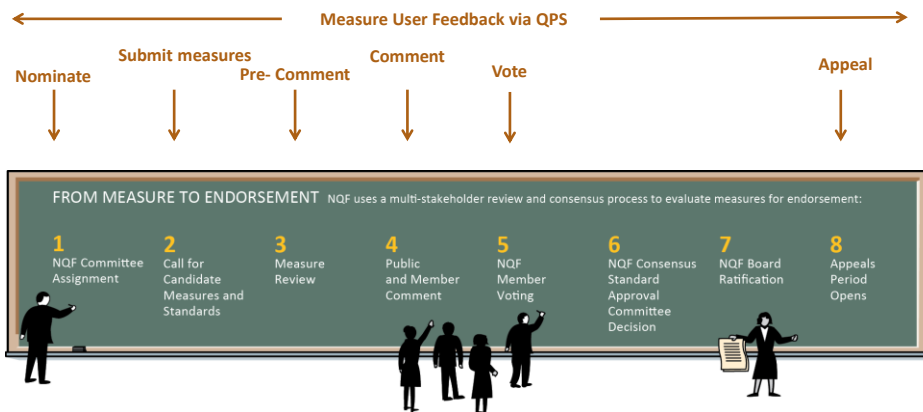
NQF Endorsed

- All measures are endorsed through the Consensus Development Process (CDP), which is continuously updated
- Measures must meet stringent criteria
- Endorsement is the “gold standard” for measures
- 600+ measures currently endorsed
- The CDP relies on multi-stakeholder input at every step

NQF Endorsement Process

- NQF has been endorsing measures since 2001
 - “NQF-endorsed measure” is a respected brand
 - All NQF-endorsed measures are in QPS
 - Endorsement via the Consensus Development Process (CDP)
 - Participation by a variety of stakeholders
 - ❖ “Multi-stakeholder” participation is foundational to NQF
- Consensus depends on participation and feedback from members and stakeholders
- Over the years, the CDP has been revised, always encouraging more feedback from members and stakeholders

Key Times for Input in the Consensus Development Process



Consensus Development Process



Step 1: NQF Committee Selection

- Call for nominations
- Seating a multi-stakeholder committee

Member Input

- Nominate to a committee
- Comment on proposed committee selection
- Provide feedback about measures in QPS



Role of Standing Committee

NQF Standing Committees:

- Serve in an oversight function of evaluating measures against NQF's measure evaluation criteria
- Identify gaps in the measurement portfolio
- Provide feedback on how the portfolio should evolve
- Serve on any *ad hoc* or expedited projects within designated topic areas



Consensus Development Process

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Step 2: Call for Candidate Measures

- Soliciting measures to be submitted to NQF

Member Input

- Submit measures
- Provide feedback about measures in QPS



Consensus Development Process

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Step 3: Measure Review

- Pre-commenting period
- Committee recommends measures for endorsement
- Draft report and recommendations issued

Member Input

- Comment on measures
- Join committee meetings virtually or in-person; opportunity for public comment during all meetings



Consensus Development Process

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Step 4: Public and Member Comment

- Multi-stakeholder input on recommendations

Member Input

- Comment on draft report



Consensus Development Process

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Step 5: NQF Member Voting

- NQF Member voting on recommendations for endorsement

Member Input

- Vote on recommended measures
- Provide feedback with votes



Consensus Development Process

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Step 6: Consensus Standards Approval Committee Review (CSAC)

- CSAC reviews Committee recommendations and results of member voting
- CSAC determines whether consensus has been reached

Member Input

- Attend CSAC meeting virtually or in-person; opportunity for public comment at all meetings



Consensus Development Process

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Step 7: NQF Board Ratification

- NQF Board grants endorsement

Member Input

- Attend Board meetings virtually or in-person; opportunity for public comment at all meetings



Consensus Development Process



Step 8: 30-Day Appeals Period

- Any interested party may file an appeal of the endorsement decision with the NQF Board of Directors

Member Input

- Members may file an appeal during this time



Maintenance of NQF Endorsement

- NQF-endorsed measures are re-evaluated approximately every 3 years to ensure they continue to meet NQF criteria
- Emphasis at maintenance of endorsement:
 - Current performance/opportunity for improvement
 - Current use
 - » How broadly is the measure used?
 - » Public reporting? Payment adjustments?
 - What is the impact of the measure?
 - » Improvement over time? Improvement in patient outcomes?
 - » Unexpected positive or negative consequences

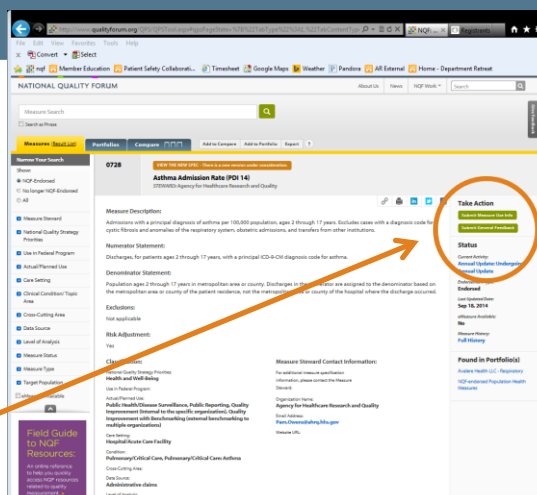


Measure User Feedback in QPS

1. When there is follow-up from a CDP project
 - Deferred decisions
 - Directives from CSAC or Board of Directors
 - Related and competing measures/harmonization
2. During *ad hoc* reviews of measures
3. When there is a topic area consultation to another Standing Committee

Purpose of the Perinatal and Reproductive Health CDP project

To identify and endorse performance measures for accountability and quality improvement that specifically address conditions, treatments, interventions, or procedures relating to perinatal and reproductive health. The project will focus on the following topics and conditions: reproductive health, pregnancy planning and contraception, pregnancy, childbirth, and post-partum and neonatal care.

Neurology CDP Project

Purpose of the Neurology CDP project

To identify and endorse new performance measures for accountability and quality improvement that specifically address conditions, treatments, interventions, or procedures relating to neurologic conditions such as stroke, epilepsy, multiple sclerosis, dementia, Parkinson's and Alzheimer's disease, traumatic brain injury, and other neurological conditions at various settings of care. The project will also review previously endorsed measures for scheduled maintenance.

Cancer CDP Project

Purpose of the Cancer CDP project

To identify and endorse performance measures for accountability and quality improvement that specifically address conditions, treatments, interventions, or procedures relating to pulmonary conditions and critical care. The project will build on the following topics and conditions addressed by previously endorsed NQF measures: asthma management, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, mortality, pneumonia management and mortality, and critical care mortality and length of stay.

Palliative and End-of-Life Care CDP Project

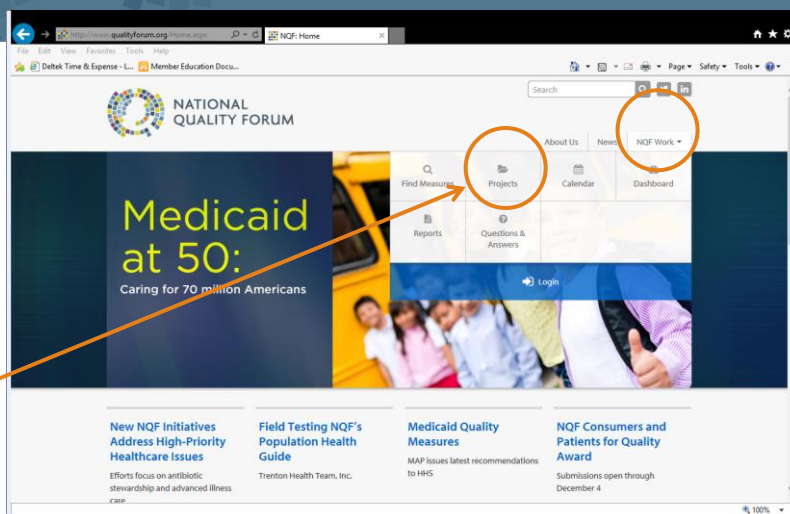
Purpose of the Palliative and End-of-Life Care Project CDP project

To identify and endorse performance measures for accountability and quality improvement that specifically address conditions, treatments, interventions, or procedures relating to the various facets of palliative and end-of-life care, including, but not limited to physical, emotional, social, psychological, and spiritual aspects of care; access to and timeliness of care; patient and family experience with care; patient and family engagement; care planning; avoidance of unnecessary hospital or emergency department admissions; appropriateness of care; cost of care; and caregiver support.
