If necessary, add attachments at bottom of Scientific
 Acceptability tab, data field 2.1. Supplemental Testing
 Methodology Information

3. Process: Annual Update

- Document the process of determining the ICD-10 codes (Word or PDF), including:
 - Names and credentials of experts
 - Summary of stakeholder comments
 - Results of any testing
- Send attachments to <u>measuremaintenance@qualityforum.org</u> when submitting Annual Update
 - Cannot add attachments to Annual Updates online at this time, so NQF staff will do it behind the scenes

Gastrointestinal (GI) and Genitourinary (GU) Endorsement Maintenance Project—Testing Elements of the Two-stage CDP



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Proposed Two-Stage Endorsement Process

Stage 1: Measure Concept

- ✓ Focus on importance to measure and report (evidence, gap, impact)
- ✓ Concept: Numerator, denominator, exclusion statements
- ✓ Identify related and competing measures
- Process: SC approval, 30-day comment period, CSAC and NQF Board approval



 ✓ Focus on scientific acceptability, feasibility, usability
 ✓ If concept approved, submit specified and tested measure
 ✓ Process: SC approval, 30-day comment, two- week vote, CSAC approval, Board ratification

Endorsement

Goals

- This two-stage process is intended to be *iterative* and a *first step* to test:
- Stage 1:
 - Effectiveness of technical assistance and revised measure submission form
 - Scalability of concept evaluation across all CDP projects
 - Overall cycle time for concept review
- Stage 2:
 - Overall cycle time for fully specified and tested measures
 - Determine effectiveness of process improvements and staging of the evaluation

Potential Concepts Identified to Date

- GI concepts (~ 8)
 - Irritable bowel disease
 - Colonoscopy screening and surveillance
- GU concepts (~10)
 - Stress urinary incontinence (SUI)
 - Pelvic floor repair

Stage 1 Evaluation: Measure Concept

Includes:

- Numerator statement
- Denominator statement
- Exclusions under consideration
- Risk adjustment variables under consideration
- Preliminary specifications (not necessarily coding)
- Planned use
- Mapping to taxonomy (i.e., proposed levels of analysis, data source, settings of care, topic area)

What will be evaluated in Stage 2?

- Measure with specifications and testing results
- Data on remaining three criteria:
 - Scientific Acceptability
 - Usability and Use
 - Feasibility

Stage 2 Proposed Process

Technical Assistance

- Developers will be required to seek technical assistance prior to submitting measures to Stage 2
- 30 days prior to the submission deadline

- Maintenance measures will need to go through Stage 1 and Stage 2 reviews
- Evaluation does not change measures must still pass all criteria
- Developers would have up to 18 months to bring full specifications and testing results on reliability and validity for Stage 2 submission
 - If not submitted within 18 months, would require submission for Stage 1 review again

Anticipated Challenges

- No competing concepts/measures identified thus far
- Few related measures requiring harmonization anticipated
