

Measure Selection Tool User Guide

Overview

Over the past decade, the National Quality Forum (NQF) has endorsed over 600 healthcare performance measures addressing many important areas of health and healthcare. Measures that are useful for one purpose and area of healthcare may not be as useful for other purposes. With limited time and resources to help review the different measures and their uses, it can be difficult to identify appropriate measures for use.

As a first step in helping organizations in their efforts to identify appropriate, high priority measures, NQF has identified and applied 7 measure selection attributes to the portfolio of endorsed measures. These attributes are now available for use in the Quality Positioning System (QPS) as additional filters on the left-hand side of the screen.



What do the Measure Selection Attributes Mean?

Attribute	Question	Attribute Assignment Guidance
Outcome-focused	Does the measure reflect a change in clinical status?	Based on Measure Type
Highest Opportunity for Improvement	Does the measure have a significant variation in performance?	Based on Standing Committee vote for Opportunity for Improvement
Patient- and caregiver-focused	Is the measure result meaningful to patients and their caregivers?	Measure addresses HRQoL, Symptoms, Experience with Care, Healthy Behaviors, Harm, Financial Stress, Satisfaction, Care Coordination/Continuity of Care, Wait Times, Patient and caregiver autonomy/empowerment
Coordinated and Integrated Care	Does the measure reflect a collaborative and coordinated health system?	Measure addresses admissions, care coordination/continuity of care, efficiency, palliative care
Prevention and Population	Does the measure address preventive care and care across broad populations?	Measure addresses prevention and population health, social determinants
Highly Prevalent Conditions	Does the measure address one or more pervasive and harmful conditions?	Based on top causes of morbidity and mortality for adults and children
Lowest Data Collection Burden	Does the measure have minimum impact on clinical workflow and limited upfront investment?	Based on data source

Each attribute aims to answer a specific question to which a user may be seeking a response:

How do I use the Measure Selection Attributes in QPS?

The Measure Selection Attributes are multi-select filters that have been applied to NQF's body of currently endorsed measures. They are designed to work in tandem with the filters previously available in QPS.

As additional filters are applied, the world of NQF endorsed measures will be narrowed to include only measures that meet each of the filtering criteria applied.

For example, if a user would like to find the measures with the highest opportunity for improvement, within the inpatient or hospital care setting that deal specifically with falls and traumatic injury, a user

would apply the filters as follows:

- Measure Selection Attribute: "Highest Opportunity for Improvement"
- Care Setting: "Inpatient/Hospital
- Clinical Condition/Topic Area: "Musculoskeletal > Falls and Traumatic Injury"

Applying each filter would narrow the world of NQF measures to only those measures which are currently endorsed and meet each criteria selected.
