## **Submission Details**

Innovation Challenge submissions may be submitted online beginning October 16 and should address the following:

> Which of the Principles for Making Health Care Measurement Patient-Centered does your submission address? (Submissions can address more than one principle)

> Which stakeholder group(s) does your submission engage?

> Which phase(s) of performance measurement does your submission address?

> Briefly describe the patient-centered measurement challenge you are trying to solve and how it affects patients and caregivers? Please note any collaboration with patients and caregivers in identifying this challenge.

> What type of work is required to implement your idea? Please describe how patients and caregivers would be engaged in this work. (Include level of effort or a description of the scope of work)  What solutions have you identified and/or implemented to address the patient-centered measurement challenge? Have they been successful?
What are the lessons learned? Are there other opportunities for improvement that support your topic?

> Can this work be replicated by others? And, if so, how?

> Describe how your idea incorporates patient and caregiver priorities. Please note any collaboration with patients and caregivers in shaping your idea.

> Submissions may present work from an existing project or theoretical solutions. Novel approaches or new applications of existing solutions—from within and outside of healthcare—are encouraged.

Innovation Challenge submissions must be submitted via the online submission form by November 15, 2017 to be eligible for consideration. Email submissions will not be accepted.

## **Evaluation Criteria**

Priority will be given to submissions that:

- > Describe an approach that would contribute significantly to patient-centered measurement by:
  - Enabling meaningful patient engagement throughout measure development, implementation, and/or reporting/ benchmarking
  - Capturing a broad range of patient and/or caregiver perspectives
  - Providing innovative solutions and streamlined approaches to obtaining patient guidance on measurement

> Are broadly applicable across different patient populations, healthcare settings and/or measurement gap areas > Represent novel approaches or new applications of existing solutions—from within or outside of healthcare

- If theoretical, the submission should describe how the idea improves upon existing approaches in healthcare performance measurement or has been applied successfully in other industries
- > Have demonstrated success
  - If theoretical, the submission should explain how the idea could be implemented successfully and how success would be measured
- > Can be replicated by others
  - If theoretical, the submission should illustrate how the idea could be widely implemented
