Measurement Science



Overview of Ambulatory Care Patient Safety Project

Project Objectives

- Convene a multistakeholder advisory group to guide and provide input on the direction and findings of the environmental scan;
- Conduct an environmental scan of relevant measures, measures in development, testing, and use, and measure concepts related to ambulatory care patient safety in the non-elderly population; and
- Develop a written report summarizing the findings of the environmental scan and highlights gaps in measurement

Roles of the Advisory Group & NQF Staff

Advisory Group

- Serve as experts working with NQF staff to achieve the goals of the project
- Review meeting materials and participate in all meetings
- Guide and provide input on:
 - Environmental Scan (e.g., key words, measure concepts, etc.)
 - Identification of measures or measure concepts related to ambulatory care patient safety
 - Identification of measurement gaps and high-priority measurement areas
 - Draft Environmental Scan Report
- Provide recommendations for future activities related to ambulatory care patient safety

NQF Project Team Staff

Work with the advisory group to achieve project goals:

- Organize and staff meetings and conference calls
- Ensure communication among all project participants
- Facilitate necessary communication and collaboration between different NQF projects and external stakeholders
- Respond to NQF member and public queries about the project
- Maintain documentation of project activities
- Draft and edit reports and project materials
- Publish final project report

Environmental Scan

Environmental Scan Overview

- The environmental scan will identify:
 - Measures
 - Measure concepts
 - Gaps in measurement
 - Themes and challenges related to measure development
- Identify peer-reviewed journals, effective interventions, tools, and conceptual frameworks related to food insecurity and housing instability.

- Information sources:
 - PubMed
 - » Medline
 - Academic Search Complete
 - Grey Literature (i.e., academic or policy literature that is not commercially published)
 - » Government publications (e.g., federal or state agency reports, rules and regulations, etc.)
 - » Reports or publications from foundations, associations, or non-profit groups
 - » Conference papers, abstracts, or proceedings
 - » Key informant interviews

Project Scope

- Ambulatory care includes: care provided in physician offices, nurse practitioner, clinic, and urgent care centers
- Does not include: emergency departments, physical, speech or occupational therapy, home health, hospice, community based care, outpatient surgery, radiology, gastroenterology, chemotherapy or dialysis

Definitions

- Performance measure a fully developed metric that includes detailed specifications and may have undergone scientific testing
- Measure concept an idea for a measure that includes at least a description of the measure, ideally including planned target and population
- Patient safety measures measures related to the prevention and mitigation of healthcare-associated harm caused by errors of omission or commission, or involving the establishment of operational systems and processes that minimize the likelihood of errors and maximize the likelihood of intercepting them when they occur

Research Questions

- What measures and/or measure concepts are currently in use for ACPS?
- What measures are currently in development for ACPS?
- What are the measurement gaps related to ACPS?
- What are emerging topics and themes in ACPS measurement?
- What are priority measures of patient safety in the ambulatory care setting for the nonelderly population?

Search Terms

For the environmental scan of measures, these terms are combined with terms like "measure," "survey," "scale," etc.

- Organizational approaches (to patient safety)

Key Informant Interviews

- To supplement the information and data found within the literature review, we will also conduct a series of key informant interviews to obtain information and details on ambulatory care patient safety we could not obtain through the literature.

- NQF will identify a list of candidates and contact them to arrange an hour interview in winter 2018.


