Dr. Little started his undergraduate education at the University of Michigan with a bachelor's of science in chemistry, cellular & molecular biology followed by medical school at Wayne State University and residency at Northwestern University, Feinberg School of Medicine. He then completed a fellowship in adult reconstruction at Indiana University Medical School. Dr. Little's academic orthopaedic surgery career started at Henry Ford Hospital where he was senior staff, was on multiple committees, served as the leader of the Total Joints Division, and was a key faculty member of the residency program. He was also voted best teacher of the residency program multiple times. In 2009 he moved to the Detroit Medical Center to become the Vice Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery at Detroit Receiving Hospital and Chief of the Total Joints Division. In 2010, he became Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery at Detroit Receiving Hospital where he ran the Orthopaedic Division until 2016. In 2016 the total joint division was moved to Harper University Hospital, and he subsequently took over as Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery at Harper Hospital. He was named Associate Program Director from Oct 2010 – Feb 2018. In February of 2018, he took over as Specialist in Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery at the Detroit Medical Center and Chair of the DMC/ Wayne State University residency program.
