Activities in Multiple Measurement Areas

- **Performance Measure Endorsement**
 - *600+ NQF-endorsed measures across multiple clinical areas*
 - *15 empaneled standing expert committees*
- **Measure Applications Partnership (MAP)**
 - *Advises HHS on selecting measures for 20+ federal programs, Medicaid, and health exchanges*
- **National Quality Partners**
 - *Convenes stakeholders around critical health and healthcare topics*
 - *Spurs action on patient safety, early elective deliveries, and other issues*
- **Measurement Science**
 - *Convenes private and public sector leaders to reach consensus on complex issues in healthcare performance measurement such as attribution, alignment, sociodemographic status (SDS) adjustment*

Project Objectives

- Develop a measurement framework to assess food insecurity and housing instability
- Identify any existing measures and gaps in the measurement of food insecurity and housing instability
- From the existing measures and gaps, identify prioritization areas in the measurement of food insecurity and housing instability for future measure development

Roles of the Expert Panel & NQF Staff

Expert Panel

- Serve as experts working with NQF staff to achieve the goals of the project
- Review meeting materials and participate in all meetings
- Guide and provide input on:
 - *Environmental Scan (e.g., key words, measure concepts, etc.)*
 - *Development of the measurement framework*
 - *Identification and prioritization of measures or measure concepts related to food insecurity and housing instability*
- Provide recommendations for future activities related to measurement of food insecurity and housing instability

NQF Project Team Staff

Overview of Framework Projects

What is a “Framework” Project at NQF?

- Non-Endorsement and non-MAP work
- Could be federally or non-federally funded
- Could be a project to understand a particular idea or topic as it relates to quality measurement or to explore various measurement science issues
 - *E.g., Attribution, Variation in Measure Specifications*
- Could be a project to build a framework to inform measurement and measure development
 - *E.g., Addressing measure gaps, Telehealth*

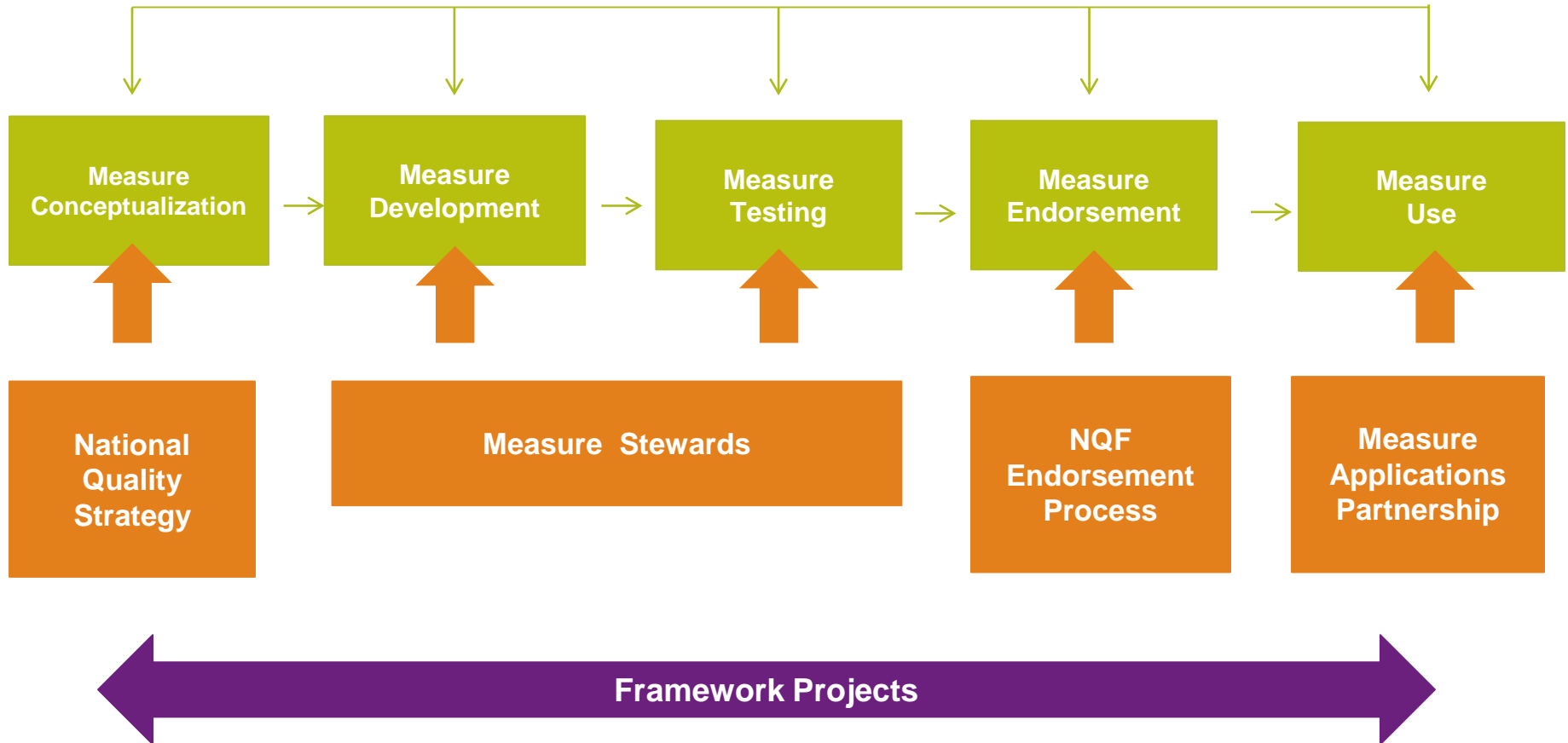
NQF: Our Integrated Approach

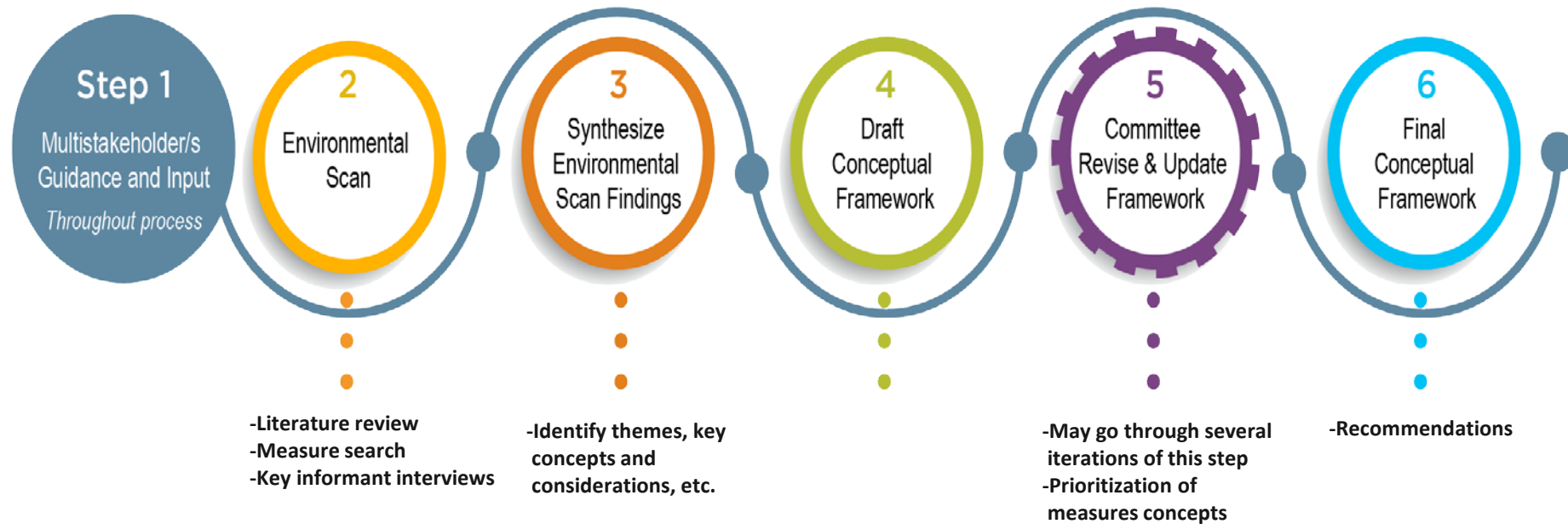


What are some of the key differences between a framework project and other projects you encounter at NQF?

- No measure evaluation
- No measure selection for federal use
- Variation in timeframes and deliverables
- More in-depth lit review or environmental scan
- Decreased likelihood of voting

What is the structure of a Measurement Framework?

NQF Framework Development Process



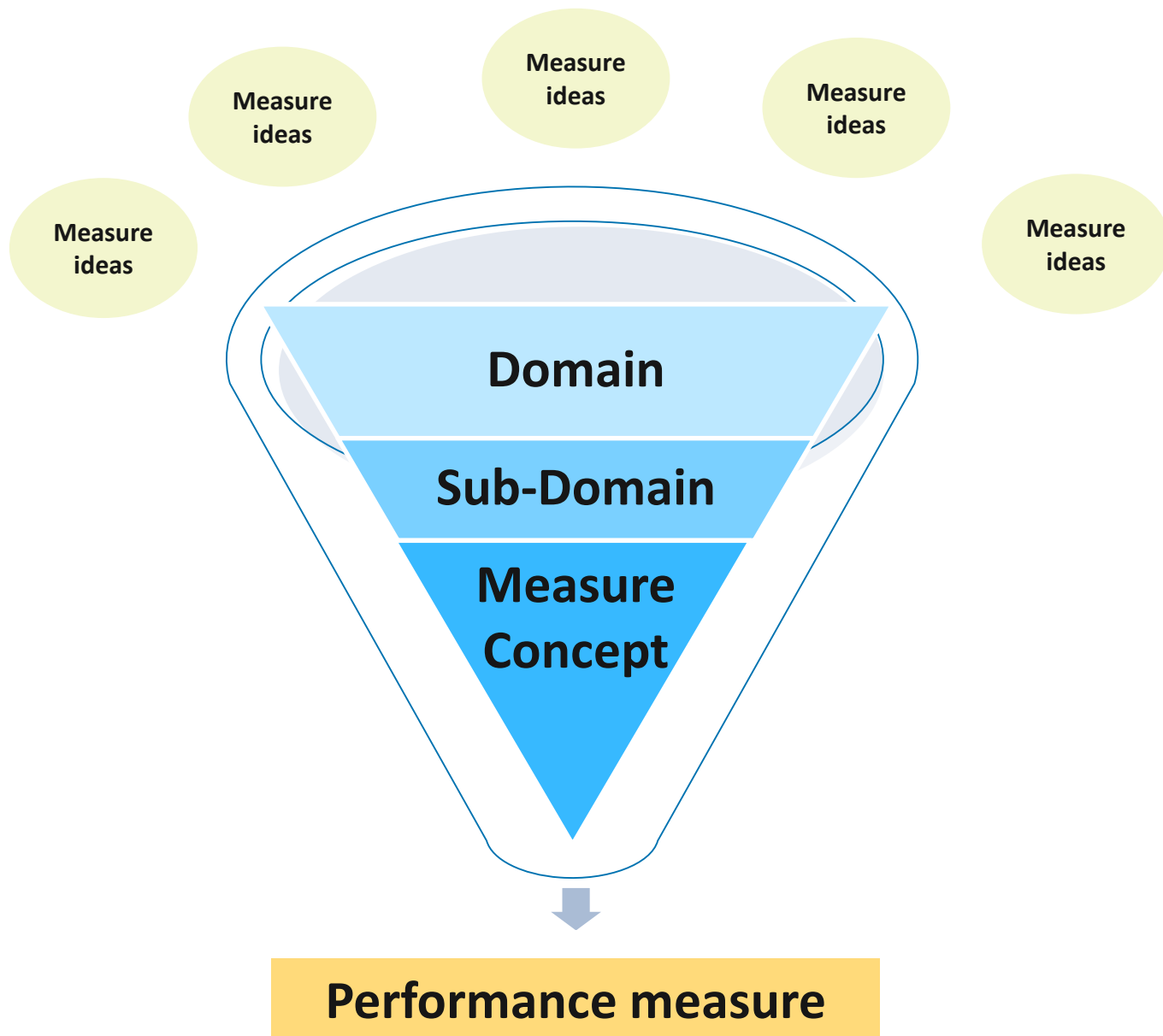
What is a Measurement Framework?

- A **measurement framework** is a conceptual model for organizing ideas about what is important to measure in a topic area.
- Measurement frameworks are made up of:
 - *Domains of measurement*
 - *Subdomains of measurement*
 - *Measure Concepts*

Measurement frameworks provide a structure for organizing currently available measures, identifying measure gaps, and prioritizing measures for future development

Considerations

- What is the desired outcome for the individual?
- Is there an accountable entity that has the ability to influence what should be measured?
- Is there variability among providers and opportunity for improvement?
- What is feasible to measure in the short, medium, and long-term?



Elements of a Measurement Framework

Measurement Framework

Domain: a categorization/grouping of high-level ideas that further describes the measurement framework



Subdomain: a smaller categorization/grouping within a domain



Measure concept: a description of a potential an assessment tool, that includes planned target and population



Performance Measure: an assessment tool that specifies a numerator (what/how/when), denominator (who/where/when), and exclusions (not) and may have undergone scientific testing

HCBS Example

Measurement Framework

Personal-Centered Planning and Coordination (domain): an approach to assessment, planning, and coordination of services and supports that is focused on the individual's goals, needs, preferences, and values.



Assessment (subdomain): The level to which the HCBS system and providers support the person in identifying their goals, needs, preferences, and values. This process should gather all of the information needed to inform the person centered planning process. Re-assessments should occur on a regular basis to assure that changes in consumer goals and needs are captured and appropriate adjustments to services and supports are made.



Measure concept: Percent responding yes to: Do you believe that the result of your "level of care assessment" identifies your real needs? (NMPQR: New Mexico CoLTS (1915c) Waiver Participant Quality Review.)



Performance Measure: an assessment tool that specifies a numerator (what/how/when), denominator (who/where/when), and exclusions (not) and may have undergone scientific testing

Environmental Scan

Environmental Scan Overview

- This Environmental scan will assist in the development of a measurement framework to:
 - *Assess the current measurement landscape;*
 - *Identify gaps in measurement;*
 - *Identify commonly measured concepts of food insecurity and housing instability (e.g., overcrowding, housing quality, etc.)*
 - *The evidence of effective interventions, and the conceptual frameworks that measure outcomes related to food and housing insecurity.*

Research Questions

- What are the most common concepts of food insecurity and housing instability measured in the literature?
- What measures that address food insecurity and housing instability currently exist?
- What are the key challenges to measuring food insecurity and housing instability?
- What are the opportunities for measurement of food insecurity and housing instability?

Operational Definitions

- ***Food insecurity* (US Department of Agriculture)** is the limited or uncertain availability of nutritionally adequate and safe foods or limited or uncertain ability to acquire acceptable foods in socially acceptable ways.
- ***Housing Instability* (US Department of Health and Human Services)** is high housing costs in proportion to income, poor housing quality, unstable neighborhoods, overcrowding, or homelessness.

Literature Review

- Identify peer-reviewed journals, effective interventions, tools, and conceptual frameworks related to food insecurity and housing instability.

- Information sources:
 - *PubMed*
 - » Medline
 - *Academic Search Complete*
 - *Grey Literature (i.e., academic or policy literature that is not commercially published)*
 - » *Government publications (e.g., federal or state agency reports, rules and regulations, etc.)*
 - » *Reports or publications from foundations, associations, or non-profit groups*
 - » *Conference papers, abstracts, or proceedings*
 - » *Key informant interviews*

Key Informant Interviews

- To supplement the information and data found within the literature review, we will also conduct a series of key informant interviews to obtain information and details on food insecurity and housing instability measurement we could not obtain through the literature.
- We welcome the Panel's suggestions for potential interviewees.
- NQF will identify a list of candidates and contact them to arrange an hour interview within late September.

Measure Review

- Another significant part of this project is the review of existing performance measures that captured the required data elements:

| Data Element | Description |
|-------------------|--|
| Title | Name of measure |
| Description | Measure description |
| Numerator | Numerator statement * |
| Denominator | Denominator statement * |
| Measure Type | Measure type based on NQF taxonomy |
| Focus | General, procedure specific or condition specific |
| Level of Analysis | Entity accountable for improving performance (e.g. state, individual provider, agency, consumer) |
| Data Source | Data source for measure information (i.e. inventory, database, repository) |
