Finalizing the Measurement Framework

Framework for Healthcare System Readiness

Scope:

- Focus on the quality measurement of healthcare delivery by the healthcare system prior to, during, and after emergencies and disasters.

Purpose:

- To serve as a conceptual framework and guidance for future development of readiness measures
- To facilitate systematic prioritization of measures and/or measurement areas

Framework Definitions

- **Measure concept** is an idea for a measure (or a description of an existing or potential assessment tool or instrument) that includes a description of the measure, including planned target and population.
- **Measure** is a fully developed metric that includes detailed specifications and may have undergone scientific testing.

The “What”	Person-Centered Capacity- and Capability-Focused Available and Accessible Maintenance of Health
The “Where”	Care Beyond Hospitals Scalability Geographical Considerations Healthcare System Size Considerations
The “How”	Communication Among Entities Preparing for the Known and Unknown Maintenance of Readiness Ongoing Measurement
