Project Goals

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Reframing of Work

- Based on the ONC Interoperability Road Map that identifies core aspects of successfully measuring interoperability
- Key Domains represent four distinctive, but interconnected areas.
 - Exchange of Data Across Disparate Systems
 - Availability of Data to Facilitate Interoperability
 - Use of Interoperability to Facilitate Decision Making
 - Impact of Interoperability on Health/Health-Related Outcomes

Measures Review

- Another significant part of this project is to determine "interoperability sensitive"
 - a quality of care metric that is designed for reporting from an electronic health record (EHR), and could capture any potential effects of EHRs.
- NQF staff designed methodology to review existing measure
 - Methodology aligned with ONC Interoperability Roadmap
- Multiple sources were used to pull related electronic outcome, process and structural measures

Rating the Measures

- The conceptual model for rating measures will make the following assumptions:
 - 1) the data needed to fill the measure resides outside of the medical entity and
 - 2) the entity has access to a health information exchange and the data can be delivered electronically.
- Three domains will be used to rate each interoperability metric:

from outside sources?

Electronic Health Information Availability

> Electronic Health Information Usage

•Does the measure require electronic health information from outside sources to be routinely used for decision making and managing care?

•Does the measure require electronic health information be available

Electronic Health Information Impact •If electronic health information was present from outside sources, how likely is it to have an impact on health/healthcare outcomes and processes?

Initial Measures Review

243 measures (AHRQ, NQF QPS)

NQF Clinical Team (MD/RN) Interoperable Sensitive Measures (68 measures)

Measures Review-Committee

- Committee will be divided into 3 groups and each group will be assigned approximately 20-30 measures
- Committee Members will use a Measure Scorecard (Excel) to rate each measure
 - » Usage
 - » Availability
 - » Impact
- NQF will compile results for In-Person Meeting (March 21-22)
