MAC Scorecard Committee's Overview

Charge of the MAC Scorecard Committee

- The Scorecard Committee is charged with exploring the existing Child and Adult Core Set measures and developing recommendations on additional measures that can be used to support the MAC Scorecard's state health system performance pillar, by
 - **Reviewing states' experiences reporting measures**
 - Recommending potential measures for addition to the Scorecard, with a focus on addressing the use and usefulness of measure implementation and reporting

Measure Review

- The Scorecard Committee review begins November 2018 and ends with a report due to CMCS by September 2019.
- CMCS will use the Committee's recommendations to inform the state health system performance pillar of the MAC Scorecard
- Guided by a preliminary analysis algorithm, state feedback, state reporting data, the Committee will engage in measure use and usability discussions to inform recommendations on suitability of measures for the MAC Scorecard.

Final Deliverable

- NQF will issue one report by September 9, 2019.
- The report will include:
 - Measure recommendations for CMCS' consideration for inclusion in the MAC Scorecard's State Health System Performance pillar.

Medicaid & CHIP Scorecard

- Provides increased transparency about program administration and outcomes for Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program
- Assist states and CMS in aligning efforts to drive improvements and increase accountability
- Overall set should be relatively small and include measures relevant to all stages of life—from infants to older adults

Medicaid & CHIP Scorecard

- First version of Scorecard (1.0) reports on selected health and program indicators for Medicaid and CHIP beneficiaries, as well as descriptive information about the programs and how they operate.
- The Scorecard will evolve and future iterations will:
 - Retain several measures from year to year to allow for analyses of trends
 - Include new measures to address areas of emphasis in the Medicaid and CHIP programs or to replace current measures as more outcome-focused measures become available

Focuses on Three Areas (also called "Pillars")

Area/Pillar	Description
State Health System Performance	 These measures show how states are serving Medicaid and CHIP beneficiaries through all life stages in six domains: 1. Communicating and coordinating care 2. Reducing harm caused in care delivery 3. Strengthening person and family engagement 4. Preventing and treating chronic diseases 5. Making care affordable 6. Promoting communities of healthy living
State Administrative Accountability	These measures provide insight on how states administer Medicaid and CHIP in partnership with CMS.
Federal Administrative Accountability	These measures provide insight on how CMS administers Medicaid and CHIP in partnership with the states.

What didn't make 1.0

- Additional measures
- Web functionality
 - Dynamically driven visualizations
 - Ability to sort and filter
 - Drill down
 - Data provider infrastructure
- Quality measurement development in key gap areas
- Quality improvement & TA efforts to bolster reporting on Scorecard measures (across 3 pillars)
- Additional data sources
- Broader stakeholder process

Role of the National Quality Forum's Scorecard Feedback

- National Association for Medicaid Directors provides feedback to CMS on all three pillars of Scorecard
- NQF process will broaden CMS's stakeholder feedback process for measures in pillar one (state health system performance)
- CMS will take all feedback on the Scorecard and make final decisions on which measures to include/change for each version of the Scorecard

January In-Person Meeting Objectives

- Review and consider states' experiences implementing and using measures from the Core Sets
- Develop measure recommendations for strengthening the Scorecard through identification of:
 - Measures to add to the current Scorecard based on existing data for the Child and Adult Medicaid Core Set measures

NQF's Approach

- The review of measures will focus on areas of high importance as well as gaps.
- The Committee will be provided measures from the Adult and Child Medicaid Core Sets not included in the current version of the Scorecard.
- Committee members will submit measures from the Adult and Child Medicaid Core Sets based on use and usability as well as relevance for use at the state level.
- All recommendations for addition to the Scorecard will require a rationale and will be discussed during the January 2019 in-person meeting.
- Discussions will be facilitated via a Discussion Guide which will provide both measure details and measure analysis.
