Decisions and/or Recommendations

The April 25 web meeting served as a forum for MAC Scorecard Committee members to discuss public comments submitted regarding the MAC Scorecard draft report recommendations and content. As per project processes, this was a discussion about the comments, and no formal decisions or recommendations were put forth. However, the Scorecard Committee agreed with several public comments, including:

- Encouraging CMCS to expand the pool of potential measures considered for additions to future iterations of the Scorecard beyond Medicaid and CHIP Core Set measures reported by 25 or more states
- Requesting that CMCS focus on defining and communicating the definition of “accountability” for the near- and long-term future
- Maintaining Scorecard parsimony by emphasizing fewer, more cross-cutting, impactful measures
- Increasing the number of robust measures that represent core Medicaid and CHIP populations (e.g., long-term services and supports, wellness, primary care and prevention for women of reproductive age, maternal and newborn healthcare, etc.)
