- Determine whether re-evaluation of any Medicaidrelevant performance measure recommendations across the four topic areas of the CMS Medicaid Innovation Accelerator Program is warranted based on public comment

NQF-Medicaid Innovation Accelerator Project Goals

- Identify and recommend measures related to the four program areas of CMS's Medicaid Innovation Accelerator Program (IAP)
 - Reducing Substance Use Disorders (SUD)
 - Improving Care for Medicaid Beneficiaries with Complex Care Needs and High Costs (BCN)
 - Promoting Community Integration Long-Term Services and Supports (CI-LTSS)
 - Supporting Physical and Mental Health Integration (PMH)
- Measures will support states' ongoing efforts related to Medicaid delivery system reform
- Measures should be ready for immediate implementation and represent the full continuum of care across various providers and care settings
- All state Medicaid agencies, regardless of whether they participate in CMS' IAP, will have access to the measures

Coordinating Committee Actions

- Review the draft report
- Review and consider the full text of all comments received and the proposed responses to the public and member comments
- Be prepared to take action on public comments. Reevaluate measures as needed
 - Retain the recommendation
 - Amend Committee responses to public comments
 - Remove recommendation

Review of Public Comments

Summary of Public Comments

- The draft report was posted for Public and Member comment on July 21 to August 21
- NQF received 28 comments from 16 organizations and individuals
 - » Public and Community Health (6)
 - » Professional Organizations (4)
 - » Supplier and Industry (3)
 - » Measure Developer (2)
 - » Consumer (1)

General Comments

Public commenters identified themes for all four program areas

- Too many process measures
- Duplicative measures or similar measures throughout
- Questions about how measures are intended to be used or aligned with Adult and Child Core Sets
- Lack of harmonization and/or recognition of similar measures in various NQF projects that include consumer and patient experience measures

Measurement Gaps

Public commenters identified measurement gaps across all four program areas

- Overall, support for additional measure development within the Medicaid population
- Not enough outcome measures
- Lack of patient centered/patient engagement measures
- Lack of measures that capture social determinants health, including food and housing insecurity, lack of transportation, functional status

SUD program

Public comments specific to SUD program area

- Too many screening measures
- Support use of opioid measures in SUDs
- Lack of harmonization and/or recognition of similar measures in various programs/projects including SAMHSA programs, demonstration projects, etc.

BCN program

Public comments specific to BCN program area

- Different opinions regarding inclusion of the Patient Activation Measure (PAM) measure (support and do not support the measure for inclusion)
- NCQA has added telehealth modifiers to the numerators of measures #0105 and #0576, helpful to states with mental or behavioral health access issues

CI-LTSS program

Public comments specific to CI-LTSS program area

- Different opinions regarding inclusion of the Patient Activation Measure (PAM) measure (support and do not support the measure for inclusion)
- Disagree that CI-LTSS is a nascent field that lacks performance measures.
- Surveys are largely not discussed (with the exception of HCBS)

PMH program

Public comments specific to PMH program area

- Acknowledged the CC efforts to highlight challenges related to integration of physical and behavioral health services
- Support many of the measure recommendations and noted that some of the potentially preventable event measures recommended for the BCN program area are also applicable for PMH
- NCQA has added telehealth modifiers to the numerators of measures #0105 and #0576, helpful to states with mental or behavioral health access issues
- Lack of social determinants of health measures for individuals with co-occurring conditions
- Recommend the development of measures that assess care integration over life course of an individual

Finalize Medicaid IAP Measure Recommendations as Needed

Potential Measure Re-evaluation

Removal of NQF #2483 Gains in Patient Activation (PAM) Scores at 12 Months

- Public commenters expressed several concerns about the measure including:
 - Costly implementation (feasibility)
 - Some research does not support its efficacy
 - Organizational experience that NQF #2483 does not result in meaningful indicators of patient engagement
- One public commenter expressed support of its inclusion because of its person-centered focus
- Does the Committee want to re-evaluate the measure based on public comment?

Potential Measure Re-evaluation

Removal of NQF #0647 Transition Record with Specified Elements Received by Discharged Patients

- Endorsement was removed from this measure in July 2017, after this project's CC in-person meeting.
- Public commenter expressed concern about including the measure since it is no longer NQF endorsement
- Does the Committee want to re-evaluate the measure based on public comment?

Coordinating Committee Discussion

- Does the Coordinating Committee have specific responses to public commenters or direction to reflect comments in the final report?
- Are there objections to approving the Medicaid IAP measure and measure concept recommendations?
