Decisions and/or Recommendations

Approval of Innovation Accelerator Program (IAP) Priority Area Measure Search Process

The Coordinating Committee (CC) approved the process for identifying measures in each of the four priority areas: Reducing Substance Use Disorders, Medicaid Beneficiaries with Complex Care Needs and High Costs, Community Integration – Community-Based Long-Term Services and Supports, and Physical and Mental Health Integration. The measure search process includes three components, the use of identified sources, the Visio Decision Logic (including the definition and key concepts) and Measure Summary Sheets. The sources include past and present NQF projects, websites from developers, professional associations and the Federal government as well as multiple state governments with measures and measure sets for each of the IAP focus areas. The Visio Decision Logic illustrates the standardized approach used to determine if a measure is suitable for each IAP priority area. Measure specifications will be collected and recorded on the measure summary sheets. There will be one measure summary sheet for each of the four IAP priority areas.

Feedback from CC on Measure Sources

The CC agreed to provide the following additional information to NQF staff by January 19, 2017:

- States that are utilizing measure sets relevant to the IAP priority areas; and
- Contact information for state representatives who can provide more information on measures relevant to the four IAP priority areas.
