Review of Measure 2872e

- Title: Dementia Cognitive Assessment
- Developer: Physician Consortium for Performance Improvement (PCPI Foundation)
- Measure Type: Process
- Data Source: Electronic Health Records
- Level of Analysis: Clinician: Group/Practice
- Care Setting: Inpatient/Hospital, Outpatient Services, Other
- Reviewed 1 time:
 - **original Endorsement Date:** September 23, 2016
 - **Most Recent Update:** September 23, 2016
- Status: Endorsed
- Description: Percentage of patients, regardless of age, with a diagnosis of dementia for whom an assessment of cognition is performed and the results reviewed at least once within a 12-month period

2 practice guidelines cited as evidence in support

Committee concern that evidence was not strong enough for assessing cognition as a quality indicator.

Public Comments

- 4 total comments from two member organizations (PCPI and the American Occupational Therapy Association) and one nonmember organization (AAN), all supportive of the measure
- Concerns/Comments
 - Measurement burden
 - Federal program standing
 - » Merit-Based Incentive Payment System and the Medicaid Promoting Interoperability program
 - Challenges of doing RCTs
 - Other complementary measures elsewhere available
 - Cognition is related to broader function (Piersol et al., 2017)
