- Re: Patient Experience and Function Spring 2021 Cycle

Background

This report reflects the review of measures in the Patient Experience and Function project. Measures in this portfolio focus on patient functional status, satisfaction, and experience of care, as well as issues related to care coordination. Central to the concepts associated with patient experience with their overall care is the patient's health-related quality of life (HRQoL) and the many factors that influence it, including communication, care coordination, transitions of care, and use of health information technology (IT). The measure in this review cycle focused on an appropriate needs and priorities assessment within service planning for individuals with disabilities receiving home and community-based services (HCBS).

The 22-person Patient Experience and Function Standing Committee reviewed one measure. This new measure was recommended for endorsement.
