Prevention and Population Health

- The National Quality Forum has endorsed population health measures through various projects since the early 2000's.
- There are more than 34 endorsed measures within the population health portfolio, including measures that focus on:
 - Health-related behaviors to promote healthy living
 - Community-level indicators of health and disease
 - Modifiable social, economic, and environmental determinants of health
 - Primary prevention and screening
 - Oral Health
- 23 process measures and 11 outcome and resource use measures

Prevention and Population Health, Spring 2018

- One maintenance measure assessing cancer screening under review:
 - No new measures submitted for review
 - No measures submitted to the Scientific Methods Panel for review of the Scientific Acceptability criterion

 - 2372 Breast Cancer Screening
