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What is Trial Measure Approval?

- A path for eMeasures that are ready for implementation but cannot yet be adequately tested to meet NQF endorsement criteria for Scientific Acceptability.



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Requirements for all eMeasures

- Specified in HL7 Health Quality Measures Format (HQMF)
- Measure logic represented using the HQMF and Quality Data Model (QDM) format
- Uses value sets that are cataloged in the Value Set Authority Center (VSAC) database, or if new value sets – are properly vetted.
- Assessment of both data element feasibility and measure logic feasibility

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Evaluation of eMeasures for Endorsement

1. Importance: Evidence, Performance Gap, Priority
2. Scientific Acceptability (must pass):
 - ✓ eMeasures must be tested in 3 EHRs
3. Feasibility:
 - ✓ eMeasure Feasibility Criteria which gauges “implementation readiness”
4. Usability and Use (planned)
5. Related and competing measures (identified, harmonized, justification)

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Evaluation: Endorsement and Trial Approval Pathway

Importance to Measure and Report: Extent to which the specific measure focus is evidence-based, important to making significant gains in healthcare quality, and improving health outcomes for a specific high-priority (high-impact) aspect of healthcare where there is variation in or overall less-than-optimal performance.

1a. Evidence to Support the Measure Focus

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Evaluation: Endorsement

Scientific Acceptability:

Reliability - 2a1: The measure is well defined and precisely specified so it can be implemented consistently within and across organizations and allows for comparability

Reliability testing—data elements or measure score - 2a2: Demonstrates the measure data elements are repeatable, producing the same results a high proportion of the time when assessed in the same population in the same time period and/or that the measure score is precise.

Evaluation: Trial Approval Pathway

Reliability - 2a1 only: The measure is well defined and precisely specified so it can be implemented consistently within and across organizations and allows for comparability

Scientific Acceptability	
Validity - 2b1: Measure specifications are consistent with the evidence provided in support of the measure (criterion 1a) 2b2. Validity testing—data elements or measure score: 2b3. Justification of exclusions—relates to evidence: 2b4. Risk adjustment 2b5. Identification of differences in performance 2b6. Comparability of data sources/methods	Validity - 2b1 only: Measure specifications are consistent with the evidence provided in support of the measure (criterion 1a)

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Evaluation: Endorsement and Trial Approval Pathway

Feasibility: Extent to which the specifications including measure logic, require data that are readily available or could be captured without undue burden and can be implemented for performance measurement.

3a. Byproduct of Care Processes

3b. Electronic Sources: The required data elements are available in electronic health records or other electronic sources. If the required data are not in electronic health records or existing electronic sources, a credible, near-term path to electronic collection is specified.

3c. Data Collection Strategy

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Evaluation: Endorsement and Trial Approval Pathway

Usability and Use: Extent to which potential audiences (e.g., consumers, purchasers, providers, policy makers) are using or could use performance results for both accountability and performance improvement to achieve the goal of high-quality, efficient healthcare for individuals or populations.

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Why is Trial eMeasure Approval Needed?

- **Encourage eMeasure Development**
 - eMeasures are still a relatively new area for measure developers
 - Limited opportunity for measure developers to test measures on multiple (EHRs) before submitting measures for endorsement
- **Meet the Requirements for Meaningful Use**
 - Participants in Stage 2 Meaningful Use will submit clinical quality measures (CQMs) electronically beginning with CY/FY 2014
 - Meaningful Use Stage 3 is likely to follow the same format as the first two Meaningful Use stages but would have higher thresholds and more extensive requirements

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What is the Benefit to Trial eMeasure Approval?

- **Good Measures Implemented Quickly**
 - eMeasures are reviewed by CDP against the NQF Measure Evaluation Criteria
 - If a eMeasure can satisfy the Measure Evaluation Criteria – with the exception of testing, it should be implemented in the field
 - Trial Measure Approval can be a path to endorsement

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Trial eMeasure Approval Process



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What Happens Next?

The measure developer is encouraged to bring the eMeasure back for full endorsement by the Standing Committee within 3 years for full NQF endorsement.

- **Submission within 3 years:**

Option 1: Submit and evaluate only Scientific Acceptability of Measure Properties, including the final eMeasure specifications and all testing. ***Maintenance due 3 years from date approved as a trial measure.***

Option 2: Submit and evaluate on all criteria. ***Maintenance due 3 years from the new endorsement date.***

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Can Any eMeasure Be Included in the Pilot Program?

No –

- There is limited space in the Pilot
- The eMeasure must satisfy the **NQF eMeasure Feasibility Assessment**
- eMeasures that are topically relevant to current CDP projects are a priority

Current Trial eMeasures –

- Four trial measures approved in the Musculoskeletal project
- One measure under review in Behavioral Health project

Online Measure Submission

To submit a performance measure, a steward must complete and electronically submit the online measure submission form for each measure they wish to submit to NQF for consideration.

NQF is using an online Measure Submission Form, Version 6.5. The online submission form includes a variety of features and allows the user to:

- Gain secure access to the submission form from any location with an internet connection;
- Save a draft version of the form and return to complete it at his or her convenience; and
- Print a hard copy of the submission form for reference.
